#### **Presentation**

The Colombian Network of International Relations (RedIntercol) and the School of Law, Political Science and International Relations at the Universidad del Norte, invites International Relations scholars, practitioners and students to present paper or panel proposals for Redintercol's VI Convention: "A decade of Great Global Transformations: Views from Latin America," to be held between October 2nd and 4<sup>th</sup>, 2019 in Barranquilla, Colombia.

Since its first iteration in that city in 2009, RedIntercol conventions have become the main forum for academic discussion in the field of International Relations in Colombia. These conventions have addressed topics such as the state of the discipline in Colombia, the region and the world, the challenges of global politics in times of change and volatility, the state of integration and regionalism in Latin America, Colombian foreign affairs, and international security, among others.

It is interesting to note that in 2019 Colombia commemorates 200 years of existence as a political actor and as an active player in regional and international relations of various kinds. In view of such commemoration, it is well worth analyzing how this was achieved and developed, as well as what this has represented for multiple social actors and stakeholders involved in the process of national construction.

Two thousand nineteen is also an important year for RedIntercol as it commemorates a decade of activities, wherein it has worked as a bridge for dialogue between scholars, and as an effective tool in the consolidation of an academic community around international studies in Colombia.

Beyond the Colombian context, great global transformations, as was the case with the Treaty of Versailles a century ago, have necessitated the reexamination of configurations in the field of international relations. Ten years ago, while global societies experienced the effects of an economic and financial crisis nearly without precedent, the world was developing new proposals in all possible spheres. Today,

after a decade of notable transformations, is the perfect moment to rigorously evaluate what has been done and what is pending. Moreover, this is a great opportunity for scholars interested in international issues to meet next October, 2019 at Universidad del Norte, in Barranquilla.

The main call for papers is open to professionals in International Relations, Political Science and related subjects, as well as to graduate students (Master and Ph.D). Undergraduate students can also apply, and their proposals will be reviewed with the aim of establishing special groups to present their results and developments.

## Thematic fields

The presentation will be organized around four thematic fields:

1. Global transformations: Views from Latin America.
2. Colombia's International Relations
3. Integration, regionalism and cooperation
4. Globalization, migration and the environment

You are invited to submit personal proposals or for panels (composed of max. four papers and a moderator) around any related topic within the above fields. Participants may propose a maximum of two presentations. Forms for presentation proposals and instructions for registering participants and panels can be found at RedIntercol's website ([www.redintercol.net](http://www.redintercol.net)).

Panels or roundtables must include a chair who will serve as the direct communication channel between the organizing committee and the presenters.

- Deadline for the presentation of proposals for panels and papers (attached formats, please send them in **MS Word, without changing the format**): **March 31<sup>st</sup> 2019**. - Before **April 30<sup>th</sup> 2019**, the convention's organizers will notify their approval of the proposal and its inclusion in the agenda.

## Information about Convention fee and membership

Costs of participation in the Conference

Regarding registration fee to the 6<sup>th</sup> biennial Conference of RedIntercol, the prices are defined as follows:

- Professionals (professors and researchers): COP \$150,000.
- Undergraduate students: COP \$ 65,000.

All participants who apply to be speakers in the convention, must pay the registration fee to the event and be active members of the RedIntercol. Those who

only aspire to attend, but not act as speakers, may only pay the amount corresponding to the registration.

The membership fee to RedIntercol is defined as follows:

- Professionals (professors and researchers): COP \$ 180,000, for the period 2019-2020, that is, the fee covers two years of membership.
- Undergraduate students: COP \$ 90,000, period 2019-2020.

It is important to keep in mind that the payment of the membership covers the period between October 1, 2019 and September 30, 2021.
